### Life and the quality of life

Coming back from work, the husband sees his wife crying; she runs and holds him and cries even more saying: The doctor says that the baby will be born with no legs. In this case and many other similar cases in our daily life we only take a fast look at things, from the outside; we don't consider the heart of the matter; in this case: This couple is having a baby, this is a new life but all they can see is a problem that he will have no legs. We all know and say that happiness comes from inside but we are all looking at the outside! Money doesn't make you happy and then say: time is money!!! What's the more important, life or the way we imagine life should be? We are ready to terminate a life if it doesn't meet our criteria or our expectations. Do we appreciate life, only, as long as it's bringing money? According to our way of thinking today, if the child we are expecting is not going to be able to maintain himself and have the chance of being rich, usually we think that his life can be terminated?

What is life? Can we value life only when it meets our expectations? What about our parents' and grand-parents' life, was it valueless? These days we are trying to have fewer children in order to help them live better but have we created a happier new generation? Many families chose to have just one child hoping to give him a better life. Others are getting married really late because they had to prepare themselves. In those cases we are creating a society of more and more lonely people living in huge crowded cities, people living a lonely childhood, and individualism that cause bullying and abuse at school and later at work. People are communicating less and less every day, even with their own parents and children. Let's be clear, of course I am not trying here to reject completely today's civilization but I want to encourage you to see that life is not just a ready, "pret a porter" package. Life itself is much more important than what we call "quality of life". We calculate and take our time to form a family and at the end we end up with no children or a lonely child, and over 50% of couples split up and divorce. We try to stop an "imperfect child" birth being born with abortion. What if a child becomes crippled later in life, are we going to kill him too?? Or is one more special because we can see him, but not the other!! Life should have the same value always. Without life there will be no "quality of life". Life is the cause so how can we terminate the cause to keep a feature or a side effect? We are trying to control all aspects of our life, but when all is calculated there will be no space for hope in our lives and when there is no hope, life has no meaning.

**Welcoming Fr. Michael Bassale in Philadelphia**

I am very happy to meet you today, dear faithful of St. Mark's, in a very special and pleasant occasion, I mean the installation of Rev. Michael Bassale as the new pastor of this wonderful parish.

Two months ago, I decided to send Fr. Armenag Bedrossian, then your pastor, to California, because the parish of St. Gregory in Glendale, also needed a capable priest to serve it. Fr. Armenag, always ready to follow his superiors' orders, accepted willingly the mission of California, saying me: Kerabazardar, you know that I am happy working here at St. Mark's, but if you think that I can be more helpful to my community in a larger parish like that of Glendale, I am ready to go there. And I sent him there, where he is already working hardly as assistant to the Rev. Fr. Krikor Chahinian, appointed as the new pastor of that parish, earning immediately the respect and appreciation of those faithful.

The obedience to superiors is the better way for a priest to express his attachment to his vocation and to the service of souls. I am therefore very glad to see Fr. Armenag fulfilling with dedication his new mission .

Fr. Michael, your new pastor, is a young and dynamic priest. Like all of our candidates to the priesthood, he, as a young seminarian, was sent to the Pontifical Armenian College in Rome, where I was the Rector at that time. I therefore had the opportunity of knowing him as well as leading him in his way to the priesthood during five years. I knew him not only as an openhearted, sociable and responsible young man, but above all profoundly attached to his vocation He has been ordained in 1997, in Aleppo, his native city, as a member of the Patriarchal Clergy Institute of Bzommar, to which I belong, as many of our other priests in North America.

Fr. Michael started his pastoral mission in our monastery and seminary of O. L. of Bzommar, in Lebanon, and later in Moscow, Russia, where he displayed a considerable activity, gathering our faithful dispersed in that immense metropolitan area. After some time passed near Boston, with the permission of his superiors, in order to pursue his studies and to obtain American citizenship at the same, he put himself at

the disposition of the Armenian Catholic Eparchy in the United States and Canada, with the permission of our Catholicos Patriarch. So, I welcomed him here and entrusted him the spiritual care of our beloved community of Philadelphia. He has already initiated with apostolic zeal his new function and, as I know, he gained your appreciation and full cooperation.

I am sure that Fr. Michael will earn rapidly your esteem and sympathy, and with your help, he will succeed to organize all the needed activities. His sociable character will make easy and efficient his relationship with everybody, so that in a short time the parish life will grow in a new and appreciable vitality, obviously with your active collaboration. I think that he already has prepared a schedule of works, going from visits to the families to spiritual and cultural activities, focusing his efforts especially on our children and youths, without forgetting the elderly and the sick parishioners. I can ensure you that you will be pleased to work with him and help him in all the fields of our community life.

To him I present my heartfelt wishes for a full success and a fruitful apostolate, accompanied by my fervent prayers.

I have also the duty of thanking his predecessor, the Rev. Fr. Armenag, who for seven years has been an exemplary pastor, reorganized and revitalized this parish, and earned countless friendships among you. I know that his departure from Philadelphia has caused an evident sadness to all of you. But you know also that a priest is a servant of his community, he is like a soldier who is ready to run up where the need of souls is more pressing and urgent. He has been entrusted now the care of a community which is considered the most important of all our parishes in North America. May God assist him with his abundant graces and make his ministry as fruitful as it was here in Philadelphia.

Thanks also to all of you, dear brothers and sisters, for your enduring fidelity to your church and your indefectible attachment to your pastors. I exhort you to persevere in this way for the good of our community and the growth of your spiritual life. May the almighty God reward you and grant you his precious heavenly favors.

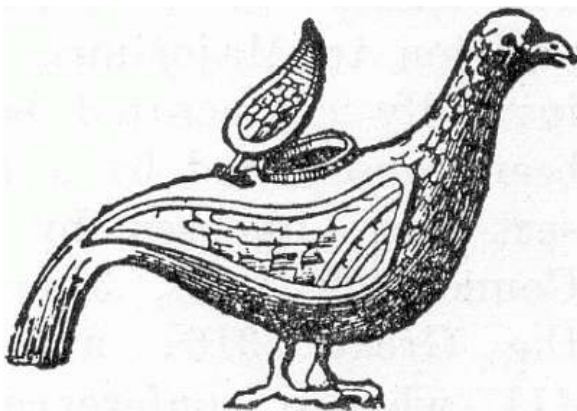

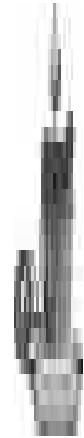

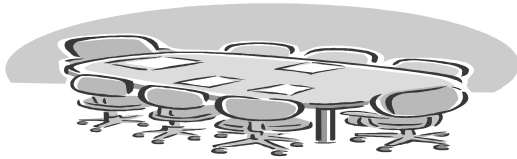
